## Policy research

#### Policy research

Research intended for policy advice and consequently policy formulation

#### Aims of Policy research

- To assist and advice policy makers on how to make better policy choices
- ☐ It enables policy makers to assess the success with which earlier policy targets and objectives have or have not been met and;
- The potential impact of the policy options.



## Policy formulation

- Policies are formulated to solve identified problems
  - What is the problem?
  - Why is it a problem?
  - To whom is it a problem?
  - What specific objectives are to be pursued?
  - What are the alternative courses of action?
- □ Example of poverty incidence in 2000 (PRSP)
- Example of Wage differentials (2013)...



#### Policy formulation...

- Policies are formulated to solve identified problems
- A decision rule will process relevant positive and normative information into a prescription intended to improve the existing problematic situation.



## Policy Failure?

- Marketing policy prescription
  - Effective policy marketing
    - Is directly tied to timing, patience, persistence and to sensitivity to the situation..
    - Person or persons with whom we are dealing
- Ultimately, policy makers have the right to say no and their intelligence is to be respected



# Importance of information in making effective policy choices

- Adequate, accurate and timely information
  - How are the citizens to form opinions about complex policy issues in the absence of relevant information
  - How are citizens to effectively monitor and control policy makers without adequate information?
- Simple or understandable terminology is important aspect of disseminating policy information.



## Important points to note

- Capacity to collect data (Internal and external)
- Need to share data
- Capacity to analyze and interpret(simple)
- Reporting/discussing evidence from data (Report, policy brief).
