Background

- Absolute poverty reduced from over 50% in 1992 to 24.3% in 2012/2013.
- Extreme poverty reduced from over 36% in 1992 to 8.4% in 2012/13.
- 2.2M Ghanaians still living in absolute poverty
- Poverty concentrated in the Rural Savannah, with >25% within the extreme poverty bracket



SP Provisions in Ghana

 National Social Protection Strategy (2007), revised in 2012.

• SP Rationalization Study conducted in 2013 established the need for a holistic National Social Protection Policy.



- Lack of the complete single household registry for targeting and enrolment
- Weak CSOs platform and private sector involvement

Way Forward


- Complete the national HH registry
